WHO'S A-ROUND

BARBARA BOND (Alice Winter) Barbara, one of the most popular school marms in Fort Smith hails from North Little Rock. This is her second appearance with L.T. and we hope there will be many more . . . We are sure you will all remember her as the lady of the sleeping pills in the recent production of "Brighten The Corner." Barbara admits that she has been "bitten" by the bug so you'll be seeing her around again.

CARLA MITCHELL (Janet, the maid) After a long stint backstage, Carla first tried her wings as Miss Tesman in the reading "Hedda Gabler." Since that stint proved "painless" she doubled in brass in the production of "Born Yesterday" appearing as the manicurist and also heading the property crew. Her last appearance for LT was in the reading "Bus Stop."

BOB DAVENPORT (James Winter, J.P.) This is probably the first time that we have had two school teachers in one cast. Bob teaches at Joseph M. Hill School and in his spare time is active in LT. He has worked backstage as well as onstage in the productions "Janus," "The Male Animal" and the recent reading "Bus Stop". Bob will best be remembered for his role of Hannibal, the violinist, in "The Curious Savage."
