Since moving to Ft. Smith from her native Indiana in 1977, she has made numerous appearances on local stages and is a charter member of the Fort Smith-based Players Ensemble, a group of actors and actresses who independently produce and perform plays and dramatic readings. In Spring of 1981, Libby was a member of the cast of "Impromptu", a Players Ensemble production, which was presented at the Festival of American Community Theatre at Ardmore, Oklahoma. She also appeared as Honey in their production of "Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf".

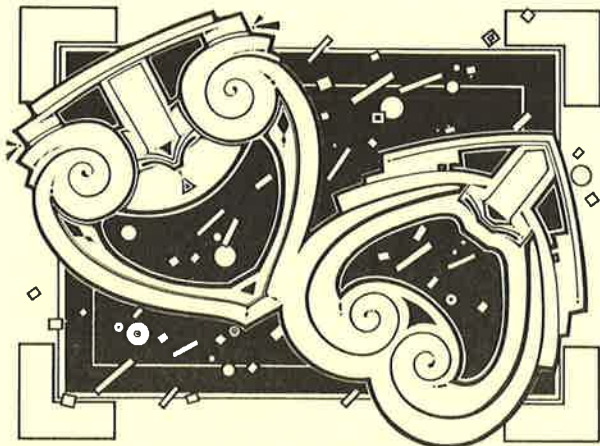

RHED KHILLING.....Shortly after producing and directing his own one man show, "Jim Bridger, Mountain Man", Rhed (William) Khilling received that phone call that actors dream about. The call led to a three-season professional acting tour with Bill Fegen Attractions of Dallas and the Antrium Bureau of Pennsylvania, through which Rhed appeared in touring company productions of "The Wizard of Oz", "Tales and Farces by Anton Checkov", and "A Christmas Carol." During his last season with the company, he also served as the unit's technical director.

Last year, Rhed returned to Ft. Smith to marry local actress Cindy Clark. Rhed has appeared in the Westark productions of "Dr. Cook's Garden", "Scratch", "Man of La Mancha", "Night Watch", "J.B." and "The Tavern". This is his fourth appearance at the FSLT, having previously appeared in "Imaginary Invalid", "Cheaper By the Dozen", and "Romantic Comedy". Rhed will also appear in "The Blue and the Gray".

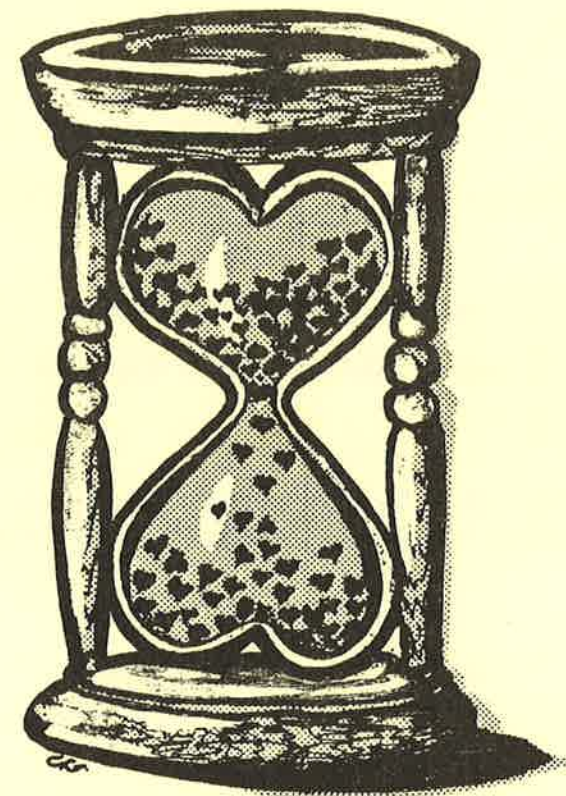
