

THE CAST...

MARY ROLLINS (*Helene Hanff*) An employee of the Fort Smith Public School System, Mary is making her second appearance on stage at FSLT. She appeared last season in **Social Security**. She has worked behind the scenes on **Broadway Bound** and **The Miss Firecracker Contest**.

BILL LINDSEY (Frank Doel) A teacher in the Mountainburg School System, Bill has appeared at FSLT numerous times in the past few years. Last seen in Noises Off, he has appeared in Biloxi Blues, Natural Disasters, and Driving Miss Daisy among others. Last season he made his directorial debut with Broadway Bound.

CAROLE ROGERS (*Cecily Farr*) Carole is making her third appearance on the FSLT stage. She was seen last season as the eccentric mother in **Social Security**, and as the school mistress in **Daisy Pulls It Off**. She appeared in the Children's Theatre production of **The Best Christmas Pageant Ever**. She is currently on the Board of Directors of FSLT.

GAYLE VYROSTEK (Megan Wells) 84 Charing Cross Road is Gayle's first venture into community theatre.

JACK MOSELEY (George Martin) Almost 40 years ago, Jack was so impressed with the performances of Tyrone Power and Anne Baxter in John Brown's Body, that he memorized the book and gave readings from it throughout northern Louisiana. Thirty years later he appeared in the FSLT production of The Philadelphia Story. Although he is the editor of the Southwest Times Record, he is best known in theatre circles as Margaret's husband.

MICKEY SUGGS (William Humphries) Mickey returned to Fort Smith from Los Angeles after a 38 year absence. He has worked in theatre productions in Fort Worth and Houston. He says his claim to fame is a small part as a bath house attendant in the old Sunset Theatre production of Will Success Spoil Rock Hunter? in which Jayne Mansfield starred. This is his first FSLT experience. He claims that the song, All my Ex's Live in Texas was written for him.

Cecily's Yorkshire Pudding

"Put a cup of flour, an egg, half a cup of milk and a good shake of salt into a large bowl and beat all together until it is the consistency of thick cream. Put in the fridge for several hours. It's best if you make it in the morning. When you put your roast in the oven, put in an extra pan to heat. Half an hour before your roast is done, pour a bit of the roast grease into the baking pan, just enough to cover the bottom will do. The pan must be very hot. Now pour the pudding in and the roast and pudding will be ready at the same time.

"I don't quite know how to describe it to someone who has never seen it, but a good Yorkshire Pudding will puff up very high and brown and crisp and when you cut into it you will find that it is...hollow inside."
