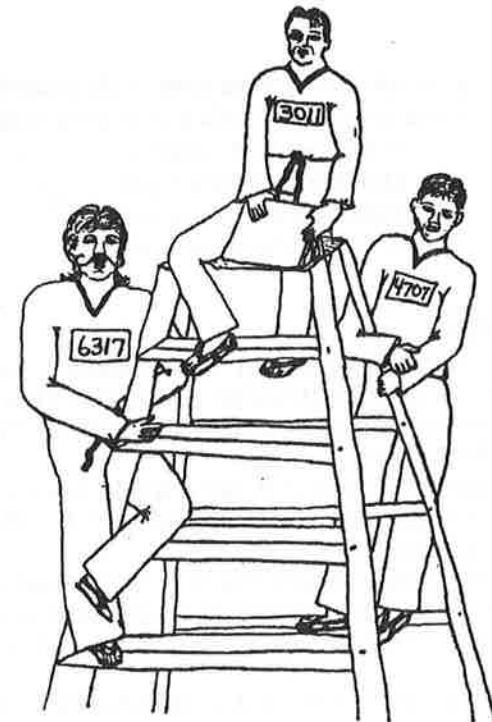

ACT One: The action takes place at the home of the Ducotel family, in the back of their general store in French Guiana. It is Christmas Eve, 1910

Cast (Off Stage):

- **Orin Frank** (Felix) has appeared in many FSLT productions over the years. You may remember him as the wheelchair-bound Sheridan Whiteside in "The Man Who Came to Dinner" or the bumbling burglar in "Noises Off." He has also directed many FSLT shows.
- **Joyce Bradshaw** (Emilie) has now been cast as a LOL (Little Old Lady) in several shows, and now finds herself becoming one naturally! She was last seen at the FSLT in "Hot L Baltimore."
- **Laura Lewis** (Marie-Louise) first appeared on the FSLT stage in "Fools" and was last seen in "Dinner at Eight." This makes her second show this year, as she was also the girlfriend in "Love, Sex and the IRS." Laura also works backstage on many shows.
- **John Davis** (Joseph) last appeared at the FSLT in "Hot L Baltimore." He also has played the role of Atticus in "To Kill a Mockingbird", a direct contrast to his role as a convict in this production. He is the proud father of a new baby girl, Emily, and two sons.
- **Matt Hutchinson** (Jules) is a newcomer to the FSLT stage, but he has appeared in Red Stocking Revues and also in the locally-made movie "Frank and Jesse." He also starred in a vignette on the history time-line at "The Gathering" last fall.
- **Aaron Shaffer** (Alfred) was a justice of the peace in "Love, Sex and the IRS" and now is on the other side of the law in this production. We think he does both equally well.

- **John Gallagher** (Henri) has played characters ranging from the husband to his real-life ex-wife to the sleazy customer who doesn't pay the hooker. In real life we think he is just a character.
- **Rick Reed** (Paul) came to the FSLT as a waiter in "Dinner at Eight." He is glad to be at the FSLT and we are glad he is with us.
- **Rebecca Libby** (Madame Parole) has done many shows at the FSLT and King Opera House Players. She also was last seen in "Dinner at Eight."
- **Max Steele** (Lieutenant) is making his first appearance at the FSLT. He hopes this will lead to larger and more exciting roles, in contrast to his sleeper of a day job.
