Regular Season Ticket patrons: After you receive your Spotlight newsletter, decide which performance date you want to attend, then call 479-783-2966 (press 2) to request your reservation. Calls will be returned in the order they are received. Your reservation requests will be accepted beginning **Saturday** (12 days before each show opens) and not before.

### No-Shows Are A No-No

All reservations are held until 15 minutes before showtime, when they may be made available for walk-ins; but, advance notice of a cancellation makes it far more likely that a seat can be filled. If you have a reservation, please call and leave a message if you will be unable to attend, "No shows" are costly; please do your part to keep our seats full.
