FSLT's *Calendar Girls* Celebrates the Charms of Mature Women

The women of Knapley (England) Women's Institute dare to reveal a little skin, and in the process learn to reveal their true selves, in playwright Tim Firth's *Calendar Girls*, opening April 5 at the Fort Smith Little Theatre. Director Eric Wells helms the production, which is based on the popular 2003 movie *Calendar Girls* starring Helen Mirren and Julie Walters.

Annie (Nikki McDaniel) and Chris (Susan Hickam) are best friends who delight in keeping their other friends at the Women's Institute laughing. When Annie's husband John (Wayne Mathews), is diagnosed with leukemia, the ladies decide to use the proceeds from the group's annual calendar to raise money for a settee in the waiting room of the local cancer treatment center. Working behind the back of their dictatorial president Marie (Nancy Blochberger), Chris and Annie call on their friends to appear in an "alternative" calendar featuring nude photos of the women posed artfully behind knitting, sheet music, and floral arrangements. The other calendar girls are single mother and church organist Cora (Micki Voelkel), buxom trophy wife Celia (Jeannie Wilson), sassy retired schoolteacher Jessie (Carole Rogers), and timid "goodie two-shoes" Ruth (Barbara Richardson). Director's Letter

I did not think I would be sitting in the Director's chair anytime soon after the success of *The Odd Couple (Female Version)*; but, oh boy was I wrong! After I committed to directing an off-season show called *Mythical Creatures and How to Approach Them*, the script for *Calendar Girls* landed in my lap. Having fallen in love with both stories, I was selected to direct both shows – BACK TO BACK! First, opening April 5, will be the full-run production of *Calendar Girls*. It follows a small group of women involved with a chapter of the Women's Institute who are raising money for a local hospital by selling nude calendars. As each woman gathers the courage to take off her clothes, she also gathers the strength to face a personal challenge in her life. Based on a true story set in England that became a popular movie, the script combines comedy, drama, anger, love, and loss. And don't worry – the naked poses are simply "suggested." There will be no nudity on our stage.

A week after *Calendar Girls* closes, I will direct the off-season show, *Mythical Creatures and How to Approach Them*. This is the hilarious adventure of two young wizards who travel abroad to meet mystical creatures including a unicorn, mermaids, and more. It's great entertainment for all ages. Suggested for 6+ years of age (approximately) and adults.

Both productions are in full rehearsal. Luckily, the casts and crews for both shows are so talented that it makes me a worry-free director despite being at rehearsals 6 days a week, working full-time, and going to school. There will be loads of talent this spring on the FSLT stage, entertaining audiences with two wildly different productions. I'm proud and privileged to direct them both, and I promise these are two shows you do not want to miss!

Off Season Production: Join Us On A Journey Of Whimsical Fantasy



Mythical Creatures And How To Approach Them is a short comedy written by Travis Greisler. Directed by Eric Wells, this hilarious production is geared to open just as *Calendar Girls* closes. Set along the lines of J.K. Rowling's famous wizarding world, we get to travel with two students Harmony Ginger (Jamie Lambdin) and Peter Wisechair (Brandon Bolin), whose semester abroad with Professor Sal Manderfin (Nathan Stockemer) is filled with different magical "mythical" creatures – like the elusive phoenix (Adeena Thomas & Allison Jones); the wise hippogriff Beaky McTalons (Jennifer Roller); the sassy unicorn Sparkles Ya Face (Shannon Stoddard); the man-crazy mermaids Aquatta (Valerie Valentine), Adella (Victoria Walden), and Adona (Meghan Partain); the flamboyant cyclops Virgil (Eric Krigbaum), who is in love with the very intimidating gorgon Medusa (Jordan Garton); and the clumsy hoarder griffin Gary (Garrett Young), who finds love when he meets the gorgeously fierce dragon Linda (Summer Robinson).

Assisted by an efficient crew comprising of Rikkee Black (producer), Sherry Hester (stage manager), Suzanne Thomas (props), Jennifer Chick and Kelsey Flippo (stage hands), Orville and Brenden Chick (techies), with Rebekah and Stephen Martin (lighting design) – Director Wells is able to sit back and focus on the getting the laughter rolling with this funny script.

Performances will begin at 7:30 p.m. (doors will open at 6:45 p.m.). Tickets are \$5 per person at the door (open seating). As this is an off-season production, no reservations will be accepted, and admission is not provided by your season ticket. Suggested for 6+ years of age (approximately) and adults.

unexpected success strains their friendships and reveals the women's inner strengths. This comedy, based on a true story, is a beautiful celebration of women's friendships.

The cast also includes Angela Covey as the aristocratic Lady Cravenshire, Kiane Anderson as broccoli-expert Brenda, London Yardley as makeup artist Elaine, Bradley Kidder as Chris's patient husband Rod, Zeke Sidwell as the shy photographer Lawrence, and Thomas Dudley as the sleazy commercial producer Liam.

The crew includes Jamie Lambdin as assistant director, Shannon Stoddard and Nathan Stockemer as co-producers, Eric Krigbaum as stage manager, Neal Goodwin as props master, Rebekah and Stephen Martin as lighting designers, Kelsey Flippo as lightboard operator, Kim Kidder and Thomas Iverson as stagehands, and Aaron Ray as the show's graphic designer.

Director Eric Wells is excited about the show's technical challenges: "The blocking is especially difficult for the 'nude photo shoot scene' where the ladies are not going to be actually naked, but they must be positioned to create that illusion."

Susan Hickam, who plays Chris, describes her character's journey: "My character strains her flower shop business, her marriage, and her



friendships when she does the right thing, but does it partially for the wrong reason. I don't think she starts off that way. She just got sidetracked. It can happen to any of us." Nikki McDaniel says that the relationship between Chris and her character, Annie, reminds her of her own lifelong best friend. She adds, "I think FSLT's intimate stage allows the audience to capture emotions from the actors that might otherwise be missed on a full, proscenium stage. But the 'suggested nudity' in this show provides challenges galore!" Barbara Richardson will make her FSLT debut in Calendar Girls in the role of Ruth. She says, "I like the idea of a group of women taking charge of their sexuality and using it for good. It is sort of similar to Steel Magnolias with its cast of strong women."

Calendar Girls opens Thursday, April 5 and continues evening performances on April 6-7 and 11-14. A Sunday Matinee is scheduled for April 8. Tickets for the Opening Night Gala performance are \$27; all other performances are \$12. Season ticket holders may call for reservations beginning Saturday, March 24. Reservations will be open to the general public beginning Thursday, March 29. Call 479-783-2966 (extn: 2) to make your reservation. And, don't delay to reserve your seat – the nudity onstage will be an illusion, but the laughter and tears provoked by Calendar Girls will be very real.
