Part Southern sass and part cutthroat reality game show, *The Glitter Girls* – running February 13-22 – focuses on a group of tiara-wearing, hard-drinking women friends in Hickman Hills, Georgia. Directed by Eric Wells, the hilarious show features a cast full of FSLT favorites. The show is written by Mark Dunn, the playwright who penned 2019's popular production *Happily Ever After: A Wedding Comedy*.

Rich, eccentric Trudy Tromaine (Angela Covey) is determined to share her fortune with her pals, The Glitter Girls, a group of close female friends who have met and shared a sisterhood for 16 years. With the help of her mysterious and suspiciously masculine maid, Arpege (Aaron Ray), Trudy is staging a big illness to find out which friend is most worthy to get control of \$16 million.

The contenders for the money are a varied bunch: Twenty-something Charlie Seaburn (Hunter Seegers) is standing in for his difficult Glitter Girl mother who is traveling abroad. Young social worker Patty Wesley (Jamie Lambin-Bolin) is a "legacy" Glitter Girl who has bonded with the group after her mother's death. Flossie Price (Rikkee Workman-Black) is an outspoken countrywoman with a penchant for wild stories. Former pole dancer and alleged town tramp Valerie Fairhope (Tina Dale) has her eye



FSLT performer, Meghan Partain, makes her directorial debut with this compelling story that is told with warmth and humor. Eleven performers take on multiple roles to tell the sweeping true story. Critics called this show "powerful" and "engrossing".

on Trudy's money with attitude to spare. Widowed Mayvonne Rausch (Micki Voelkel) is a seventh grade teacher with a huge heart. Sad-sack Corinne Culvert (Meredith Rice) is the unluckiest woman in town. Political wife and catty dress store owner Mamie Ewing (Carole Rogers) stirs up trouble whenever she can. Completing the group is Dowd Foster (Brandon Bolin) whose Glitter Girl wife, Mary Katherine, has just passed away. When the group starts to vote the contenders "off the island," the knives come out, secrets start to emerge, and the wisecracks fly!

Director Eric Wells has a great support system backstage with assistant director Emilee Dale, producer Sherry Hester, and stage manager Audra Sargent. Susan Hickam is wardrobe mistress, Joanne Peterson is handling props. Reece Whitt is responsible for set design and is aided by set crew Ember Whitt and Gary Cameron. Sound design is by Eric Krigbaum, while lighting design is by T.J. Dudley. Light and sound operators are Don Clack and Brittany Bateman. Show art is by Zack Valentine.

Wells is happy to be directing another Mark Dunn comedy: "After directing Happily Ever After: A Wedding Comedy



last year, Mark Dunn became a favorite writer of mine. When reading his script for *The Glitter Girls*, I fell in love with his characters, their personalities and their relationships, and I felt that our audience would enjoy them as much as I do."

He said, "Probably the biggest challenge was the casting. More than 30 talented individuals auditioned. I could have cast this play at least four or five different ways. But at audition callbacks, I saw the final cast come together, and I couldn't be happier with my casting choices."

FSLT veteran Rikkee Workman-Black agrees: "There are some awesome actresses in this cast...women who have been on our stage many times over many years. Being in a cast with them has been a dream of mine." She adds, "The biggest challenge for me is keeping a straight face and not laughing at others' lines."

Audiences will appreciate the mixed cast of long-time FSLT performers with a fresh face or two. Angela Covey has been onstage at FSLT since the 1970s: "Because learning lines and enduring hours of rehearsal are hard work, I'm crazy at my age to be doing this. But I was drawn to this show because it's a lighthearted comedy, and I knew I would enjoy the camaraderie of the cast and crew. I think this show will give our audience a good feeling and a welcome break from the winter doldrums." Meredith Rice, in contrast, is performing only her second role on our stage: "There are a lot of very experienced thespians in this cast. While that means I can learn from their talent and experience, it also means I have to work hard to keep up. They set a high bar."

The Glitter Girls opens with a gala performance February 13 and closes February 22. Seat selection for Season Flex Pass patrons begins at 7 a.m., Saturday, February 1.
