"For who could ever learn to love a beast?" -Prologue, Beauty and the Beast

A tale as old as time will be told at FSLT with the summer musical *Disney's Beauty and the Beast* – celebrating the 25th anniversary of its Broadway debut. Playing July 25 through August 10, the show is based on a book by Linda Woolverton, with music by Alan Menken and lyrics by Howard Ashman and Tim Rice. Director Carole Rogers and Music Director George Mann share the helm of this production.

The musical is based on the classic Disney animated film from 1991 which featured Angela Lansbury as Mrs. Potts. The live action remake in 2017 featured Emma Watson, Dave Stevens, Ewan McGregor, and Emma Thompson.

Brainy, bookish, and beautiful Belle (Jessica Smith) lives in a provincial French town with her eccentric inventor father Maurice (Barry Law), but she yearns for adventure. She also longs to escape the advances of the macho and egotistical hunter Gaston (Grant Huneycutt). When Maurice is lost in the woods, he encounters the enchanted castle of a hideous Beast (Ryan Gonzales) who has been cursed by an enchantress (Sanielle Moquett). When Belle goes in search of her father, she encounters the Beast and his servants who have been transformed into enchanted objects.

While captive in the castle, Belle is aided by her enchanted friends: candlabra Lumiere (Eric Wells), clock Cogsworth (Justin Garton), teapot Mrs. Potts (Jordan Garton), teacup Chip (Cass Moquett), wardrobe Madame de la Grande Bouche (Shannon Stoddard), and feather duster Babette (Katjana Wiederkehr). Will Belle be able to save her father, escape her captor, and perhaps transform the Beast into her prince?

Additional cast members show their talent in multiple roles: Tyler Huntington, Coleman Smith, Lexi Gartman, Marie Gray, Meredith Rice, Steve Dwiggins, Ethan Womack, John Settle, Jon Gustafson, Jeremy Marston, Jane Wineland, Caroline Gonzales, Ashtyn Marshell, Trish McCully, Lynne Gustafson, and Cliff Scott.

It is an historical fact that in the run up weeks prior to every musical audition I have ever done for FSLT, I begin a low grade panic that no one will audition for the show, and that I will end up frantically calling and begging folks to participate. Beauty and the Beast opens July 25

This complex production requires an experienced and able crew: Co-producers Nancy Blochberger and Vicki Broadaway, stage managers Kelsey Flippo and Audra Sargent, choreographer Summer Robinson, costume designer Hannah Curlin, assistant costume designer Jeremy Marston, prop master Neal Goodwin, lighting designers Rebekah and Stephen Martin, light and sound operators Mike Tickler and Kirsten Broadaway, video coordinator Ashtyn Marshell, wig stylist Randy Pace, and graphic designer Rhonda Rieder.

Costumes are a huge undertaking for this show. Helping bring designs by Curlin and Marston to life are wardrobe assistants Lynne Gustafson, Barbara Saviers, Rachel Clark, Sandra Williams, Margaret Clymer, Sherry Hester, Lora Rice, Vicki Anderson, and Nancy Blochberger.

Set design is by Mark Huneycutt, Carole Rogers, and Jeremy Marston. Set construction has been completed by Mark Huneycutt, Jeremy Marston, Bradley Nance, Joe Svetlecic, Taelyn and J.D. Novak, and Joann Peterson. The show's iconic magical and mechanical props are created by Donny Anderson, Jamie Broadaway, and Jeremy Marston. Stage hands include Jim Moody, Cliff Scott, and Thomas Iverson.

Belle is played by FSLT veteran actress Jessica Smith who first appeared on our stage as Dorothy in *Wizard of Oz*. "Growing up, Beauty and the Beast was my favorite Disney movie. Now that I'm older, I realize how wonderful the story truly is. It shows us that beauty is not about outward appearances; it's about showing kindness to others. It is both a beautiful story with beautiful music."

Ryan Gonzales is making his debut with FSLT in the role of the Beast. "My wife, Caroline, and I are new to Fort Smith, and we are excited to be cast in this production where we can be part of a whole new family." Ryan spent a lot of time on stage in musicals, plays and operas with multiple companies in Oklahoma City, his previous home. He played the Beast in his college





production and looks forward to playing it on the intimate FSLT stage. "Being at such close proximity to the audience will allow my eyes and facial expressions to contribute to the performance in a way that could not have been read in my large college auditorium."

The youngest cast member is nine-year old Cass Moquette in the role of Chip. "Beauty and the Beast is one of my family's favorite cartoons. When my mom heard that the show would be at FSLT, she asked if I wanted to audition for Chip, and we decided to audition together. We were both really excited that we were both cast. This is my first time to be in a play of any kind."

Playing Mrs. Potts, Jordan Garton says "Learning how to maneuver the enclosed tea cart that Chip is in on our small stage has been interesting to say the least. Plus wearing a teapot costume means I only have one arm free for pushing the cart!" She will be on stage adjacent to her real-life husband, Justin, who portrays the walking, talking clock, Cogsworth. "I really enjoy being a comic relief character. I get no greater joy than hearing the audience laugh."

Curlin is relying on her experience and college theatrical training to create the show's array of costumes. She began almost a year ago by soliciting the help of Jeremy Marston, another creative FSLT volunteer. Over the many months, while the magical costumes were being designed, something else magical happened – and Hannah and Jeremy are now engaged to be married. Hannah commented, "Costuming this show is a massive undertaking and we could not have done it without the help of all of the wardrobe assistants. Their countless hours of sewing and painting helped bring these creations to life."

Mann concluded, "We have assembled a stellar cast to tell a wonderful story while performing beautiful music in elaborate costumes. We invite you to come suspend real life for a few hours, and leave happy."
