# The Fox on the Fairway

Golf and sex are the ingredients in *The Fox On The Fairway*, an homage to the classic farces of the 1920s and 30s. The six-character comedy by Ken Ludwig is onstage at FSLT May 31 through June 9. Director Duff Taylor has an affinity for Ludwig's work; he previously directed successful productions of *Leading Ladies* and *The Game's Afoot: Holmes for the Holidays* at FSLT.

It's tournament weekend and Bingham (Christian Meurer) the owner of Quail Valley Country Club has bet everything on winning against constant rival Dickie Bell (John Hall) the owner of Crouching Squirrel Country Club. When his ringer competitor falls through, Bingham relies on goofy new hire Justin (Ian Miller) who has an unexpected gift for the game of golf, to compete in his place. Competition is complicated by Pamela (Nicole Bostick) Bingham's sexy vice president, Louise (Carol Sikes) the tap room waitress and Justin's devoted fiancée, and Muriel (MaryBeth McAlvain) Bingham's demanding wife. Will Justin save the day? Will Louise find the engagement ring she accidentally flushed? Will Dickie recognize his old flame Muriel? Will Muriel catch Bingham lusting over Pamela? And who will win the annual tournament?

The talented cast is supported by a first rate crew. Director Duff Taylor is joined by producer Karen Mills, and stage manager Kiane Anderson. Set construction crew includes Jim Moody, Brian Lindon, and Carrie Clark, while props are handled by Jim Moody, Thomas Iverson, and Lora Rice. Rham Cunningham and Chuck Howard handle the sound effects, while Jennie Mathews, Jeremy Marston, and Mike Tickler run the lights. Hannah Curlin provided the artwork for the production.

Director Duff Taylor says, "It is always such great fun to direct fastpaced comedies. The challenge is that I have to constantly remind the actors to start at a low pace and then build it up as the play progresses. I am thankful that the FSLT Board picks such great plays and keeps this community theatre going strong."

Nicole Bostick is happy to be back onstage at FSLT. "It's been five years since I was in a full production here last. But this one sounded like way too much fun to miss. And interestingly enough, I usually do murder mysteries – so this is a bit different for me. My biggest challenge is trying to keep a straight face through all the comic scenes. So, I sure hope that the audience gets to laugh a lot." Ian Miller agrees. The frequent FSLT actor says, "I love comedies and golf, and what a great way to be onstage with a combination of both. But unlike the usual roles I've had, I play a dorky nervous guy in this one. So my only comment to the audience is 'FORE'...!"

For FSLT volunteers there are joys to be had backstage as well as onstage. Producer Karen Mills says, "I am producing for the first time, but I have worked as backstage crew previously. I think if someone is interested in giving the community theatre experience a try, they should just show up at the next auditions and put their name down to audition or to help backstage."
