Miracle on 34th Street

Christmas Classic Concludes FSLT 2019 Season

"Well, if you're really Santa, you can do it. And if you can't, then you're just a nice man with a white beard like Mother said."

There is no room for fantasy in the lives of a divorced mother and her young daughter until a dashing neighbor and an unusually realistic department store Santa come into their lives. The 1947 film classic *Miracle on 34th Street* plays November 7 through 16 at the Fort Smith Little Theatre under the direction of Brandon Bolin.

The show was adapted from the novel by Valentine Davies by the Mountain Community Theatre. It's based on the original Twentieth Century Fox feature starring Maureen O'Hara, Edmund Gwenn, and Natalie Wood as seven-year old Susan. The film is an established holiday classic that was remade in 1994 as well.

Doris Walker (Rikkee Workman-Black) is the personnel manager at Macy's Department Store, and she has just hired the best Santa Claus the store has had in years. Even her skeptical daughter Susan (Reese Moquett) is impressed. But Doris and her assistant Shelly Shellhammer (Tina Dale) are shocked to learn that this Santa Claus believes he is the genuine Kris Kringle (Jon Gustafson) complete with next of kin Donner, Dancer,

Comet, and company. Attorney Fred Gailey (Scott Black), Doris and Susan's neighbor, is on a triple mission – win Doris's heart, help Susan believe in Santa Claus, and befriend Kris. When Kris is suspected of mental instability, Fred goes to court to prove that Kris is in fact the one and only Santa Claus.

A cast of FSLT favorites and newcomers will be on hand to tell the tale. Eric Wells portrays sympathetic Dr. Pierce, while Will Paget plays psychological evaluator Sawyer. Local politicians are portrayed by Steve Dwiggins as Judge Harper, Ryan Gonzales as political advisor Halloran,

Director Bolin is joined by an experienced crew. Suzanne Thomas is the producer, Jamie Lambdin-Bolin is the stage manager, and Audra Sargent is the assistant stage manager while also gathering the props. Scott Black is in charge of set design, and Micki Voelkel is working with Lynne Gustafson, Janet Renwick, and Valerie Valentine to create the costumes.

Brandon Bolin is directing his first full season show after debuting with an off-season comedy in 2017. "This has been one of my favorite Christmas movies for years," Bolin says. "I love the story, particularly the relationships between each of the four main characters. But as a relatively new director, I certainly didn't do myself any favors by choosing a show with 27 actors in it. The small stage at FSLT definitely creates a bit of a challenge with regard to the set – especially one that would need to accommodate over 20 actors!"

Another Bolin is involved behind the scenes. Brandon's wife Jamie serves as the stage manager. "I definitely want to help my husband bring his directorial

vision to life on stage in any way I can," she says. "Oh, the things we do for love, right?!" She continues, "This show marks my seventh year at FSLT. This year I'm thankful to have gotten the chance to play 'Gwenjane' in *Happily Ever After* and 'Elaine' in *The Graduate* – after which I got to walk down the aisle and marry my love. Nothing beats doing theatre with this community of wonderful people, and when I get the chance to do it with my husband – life is good!"

The Bolins aren't the only married couple involved in the show. Rikkee Workman-Black plays the role of Doris and her real life husband Scott Black plays her love interest in the show. "I have had the pleasure of being a part of this wonderful community theatre in various ways since 2007. It is a home away from home, and most definitely a family. I met and married my husband here, and I am happy to be playing next to him in this production."

Yet another family is involved in this show. Eleven-year old Reese Moquett is excited to be playing Susan; her mother Sanielle and her brother Cass are also in the cast. "My brother played 'Chip' in *Beauty and the Beast*. I was at the theatre a lot during his rehearsals and decided to give acting a try, too. This is my first role. I feel like I can relate to 'Susan' a lot. In fact, it feels like I just get to be myself."

Jon Gustafson who plays Kris Kringle says, "I sincerely hope that audiences sit back and think for a minute, about what each of us can do during the Christmas season to spread peace, good will, and kindness. Some answers may be deep in our imagination – let's let them emerge!"

We are sure that you wouldn't want to miss this heartwarming production that is sure to put a smile on your face and set you in the right mood for the holidays.
