FSLT Favorite Returns to Open 75th Anniversary Season

"I'll press on and take this opportunity to welcome each and everyone of you to the first ever Saturday night sing at Mount Pleasant Baptist Church"

- Smoke on the Mountain

It's 1938 in the Smoky Mountains during the last years of the Great Depression. The Sanders Family is at the Mount Pleasant Baptist Church for their first performance in five years. As Pastor Mervin Oglethorpe (Jon Gustafson) prepares his small congregation for a Saturday night sing, he must stall as the family singers have temporarily disappeared. Sanders daughter June (Meredith Rice) appears with apologies and a tale of the family bus overturning. But never fear for Mama Vera (Shanna Prater) and Father Burl (George Mann) arrive at last and envelope the sanctuary in the tornado of their family's eccentricities and musical talents.

Director Brandon Bolin and Music Director George Mann bring *Smoke on the Mountain* to life February 10-14 and 16-20. The script is based on a book by Connie Ray and story conceived by Alan Bailey with musical arrangements by Mike Craver and Mark Hardwick. This hilarious, down-home musical with a heart was an audience favorite when it was originally staged at FSLT in 1998. It proved so popular that FSLT produced both sequels *Sanders Family Christmas* in 2002 and *Smoke on the Mountain Homecoming* in 2008. FSLT is opening the 75th Anniversary Season with this nod to the past. The season will include past favorites and new productions as a tribute to the past, present, and future of the theatre.

Featured performers include Steve Dwiggins as Uncle Stanley Sanders, Jessica Smith and Wesley Fox as twins Denise and Dennis Sanders, Lynne Gustafson as Miss Myrtle and Jennie

Mathews as Miss Maude. The ensemble includes Ashleigh Mathews, Dave Whiteis, Gary Cameron, Wesley Musgrove, Donny Anderson, and Linda Dickson. In addition to Director Bolin and Music Director Mann, the crew includes Jamie Lambdin-Bolin as stage manager, Jorgi Anderson as Assistant Stage Manager, Sally Story as costumer, T.J. Dudley as props master, Bolin and Mann as set designers, and Ashleigh Mathews as choreographer.

Performer Steve Dwiggins (Uncle Stanley) says, "The small cast size is different from most musicals. The intimacy of a small cast is great fun, but it's also challenging as a performer." The gospel music in the show is a draw for Shanna Prater (Vera). "I feel like I have lived this show. I grew up in a small country town, singing these exact songs in church," she says. "This show has the most bluegrass music of any show I have ever been a part of at FSLT. That's where my roots and heart are." Meredith Rice (June) agrees. "Get ready, because the music and instrumentations in this show will blow you away!"

Director Bolin cites the show's relatable characters, heartwarming humor, and gospel music as key reasons for directing the production. "This is my first time directing a musical, so this is an enjoyable adjustment." Bolin is no stranger to musicals, however, having been featured in a number of popular FSLT musicals including *White Christmas* and *Singing in the Rain*.

While the show includes a number of veteran performers and crew members, there are some newer faces. Jorgi Anderson

began volunteering at FSLT with fall 2021's production of *Clue* then followed up backstage (with a few onstage cameos) in *Parfumerie* and *The Holiday Channel Christmas Movie Wonderthon*. She says, "It's a great group to be a part of if you want to make new friends."

Costumer Sally Story is also new to FSLT. As an instructor at UAFS with extensive theatre experience, she jumped at the chance to serve as costumer for this production. "Even though we are still in the early stages of the rehearsal process, I have learned so much about FSLT and what it is doing (a lot!) for this community," she says. "I think audiences will love this show. It's not only about a touring family that sings in church, it's about understanding each other, forgiving each other for our mistakes, and finding the humor in just about anything. The bonus is the beautiful music!"

Evening performances are at 7:30 p.m. February 10-12 and 16-19 plus a special Valentines performance February 14. Two Sunday matinees will be performed at 2:00 p.m. on February 13 and 20. Seat selection for Flex Pass Patrons begins 7:00 a.m. Saturday January 29. General public ticketing begins 7:00 a.m. Thursday, February 3. Tickets are \$20 for Opening Night and Valentines performances. All other performances will be \$12. From the Top...

Things have certainly changed since I wrote a President's letter this time last year. COVID-19 is still with us, but vaccinations are available and live theatre is once again alive and well! In addition to offering a wonderful line up of shows for 2022 and three types of season packages, we are celebrating our 75th Anniversary. Be sure to check out the celebratory activities listed in this newsletter and at fslt.org.

Amidst the mammoth amount of historical information we have read, catalogued, and archived, we found some delightful newspaper articles. One from 1948 entitled "Well, What Is A Little Theatre Anyway?" contained this quote: "There is no class distinction in the Little Theatre. There is a place for everyone. A grocer can paint scenery and girl who works at her typewriter by day can act at night." While no one works on a typewriter anymore, the rest of that quote remains true after 75 years.

Another article from 1952 stated, "A small group of faithful and enthusiastic persons who refused to be discouraged can feel proud today." While there are no living members of that original group, I'm delighted to say some of their descendants are bursting with pride. During our historical research, we were able to locate the daughter and grandchildren of Flo Pattee, the woman who proposed that the Young Ladies Guild of Sparks Hospital sponsor a theatrical production as a fundraiser – a decision that literally "sparked" the formation of FSLT. Flo's family, residing in Louisville, was thrilled to be contacted and proud to hear of our success.

My favorite newspaper quote was printed in 1960: "This Little Theatre has two purposes – to provide entertainment and have a good time doing it." This upcoming production of *Smoke* On The Mountain is the epitome of that sentence. I hope you'll grab a mask, grab a friend, and join us for this knee slapping, foot tapping, laugh out loud musical comedy.

It's going to be a great year. FSLT has a long past and a strong future. There's much to celebrate, and it's exciting to be 75 Years Young.


