DIRECTOR'S LETTER

In 1966, I was 10 years old, and in the process of growing up in Van Buren: not that that is particularly notable. But what was notable that year was that I went to the Temple Theater in downtown Fort Smith (where all the BIG movies played) and saw for the first time The Sound of Music. Eventually it filtered over to Van Buren, where it played at what was then the Bob Burns Theater. I could walk there from my home, and I have a vivid memory of using my allowance to go and see the movie twice in one day. Thus two things were born: a fascination with and longing to visit Austria, and a life-long obsession with *The Sound of Music*.

I have been privileged and thrilled to be either music director and/or accompanist in many regional versions of the stage play; I have worn out 2 VHR tapes of the movie, and am now wearing the grooves smooth on my second DVD. I have been to Salzburg more than 10 times, taken the *Sound of Music* Tour there, and sat through a *Sound of Music* Dinner Theater twice (one excellent, the second, not so much.) The point of all this is to say that directing the show here is absolutely the culmination of a life-long dream, and with all the sincerity and enthusiasm I can muster, I wish to say that that dream is now exceeding my wildest expectations.


