Request A Reservation 24/Hrs A Day

Our reservation process is easy. After you receive your Spotlight newsletter, decide which performance date you want to attend. Then call 783-2966, press 2, and leave all information as requested on the recording message. You can call 24 hours a day. Your call will be returned and reservation request handled, in the order it was received.

IMPORTANT: 1—This year, Regular Season Ticket patrons may begin calling to request seats on Saturday (12 days before each show opens). General admission reservation requests will not be handled until Thursday. 2—Gala Opening Night season ticket patrons have their same seats automatically reserved for all Gala performances. They do not ever need to call box office except to cancel their seat and/or request a seat at a regular performance.

No-Shows Are A No-No

All reservations are held until 15 minutes before showtime, when they may be made available for walk-ins; but, advance notice of a cancellation makes it far more likely that a seat can be filled. If you have a reservation - Gala or Regular Season Ticket holders and those reserving general admission seats – please call and leave a message if you will be unable to attend. "No shows" are costly; please do your part to keep our seats full.

those who might have a personal and real interest in what her will includes. The dark and dreary old mansion awaits two of Minerva's nieces. Belle Hamilton (Nichole Bostick) and her younger sister, Mary (Summer Ferguson). Mary is the first to arrive, accompanied by her uninvited fiancé, Keith Latimer (Steven Martin). Belle quickly follows, along with her also uninvited significant other, Pete Martinelli (Terrance Dilley), who is not too bright and has some rough edges. Minerva is not amused by the uninvited guests. Let the games begin. But wait, there is yet another uninvited guest—The Man (Wesley Rester), almost invisible. Blow the whistle...now let the games begin.

FSLT Renovation Project Announced

As we enter 2012, the Fort Smith Little Theatre marks two significant events. We have now been continuously operating for 65 years and have been performing in our current facility for 25. As we celebrate these major milestones, it is time for a very important project.

In the coming months, we will begin an extensive renovation of our lobby, bathrooms, and lightbooth. Steadily developed over the past several years, the project is driven by our need to repair our public areas, preserve our history, and improve our use of space.

It will involve organizing and preserving the documentation of our history, taking us back through our colorful past. At the same time, the repairs and renovations will provide an updated appearance to move us forward and prepare our facility for the next 25 years of performances. In other words, we're going Back To The Future.

Repairing

From reconfiguring our lobby heat and air, to replacing the water fountain, the repairs will be both large and small. As the symbol of FSLT, our stained glass Harlequin Man will be restored and specially lighted in a new place of prominence.

Preserving

Our cast photos are fading rapidly; soon, many will not be legible. The photos will be digitally preserved, posted on our website, and displayed on large monitors in our lobby. Show programs, newsletters, and newspaper articles accumulated since 1947 will also be organized.

Improving

Without expanding the building, we will improve our use of space. The plan includes expanding overhead storage, reconfiguring the box office, and installing stairs in place of the vertical ladder to provide safe access to the light booth.

Thanks to prudent fiscal management and some significant gifts designated for this project, work will begin very soon. Construction will be scheduled in stages to accommodate production dates and the availability of funding. With your financial support, the work can be accelerated and the project completed this summer.
