The musical based on the Charles Schulz comic strip has music and lyrics by Clark Gesner and Andrew Lippa. Brandon Bolin directs and George Mann is the music director.

The stage musical was originally produced off-Broadway in 1967 starring Gary Burghoff and Bob Balaban as Charlie Brown and Linus. In the 1999 revival, with revised script and music, Anthony Rapp and B.D. Wong starred as Charlie Brown and Linus. The show made a star of Kristin Chenowith as Sally.

Charlie Brown (Wesley Fox) is just a little kid who struggles with the meaning of life, football, homework, crushes, and friendship. He is an eternal optimist despite not quite achieving his goals. His younger sister Sally (Shannon Stoddard) is more confident. Charlie Brown's good friend Linus Van Pelt (Coleman Smith) has a philosophical frame of mind, but



You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown opens February 15

he needs the constant companionship of his security blanket to function. Linus's sister Lucy Van Pelt (Megan Henley) is bossy, selfish and opinionated and enjoys making life more difficult for Charlie Brown. Lucy has an unrequited crush on Schroeder (Eric Wells) a young Beethoven fanatic who plays his toy piano with great skill, and who would prefer to play baseball to receiving Lucy's affections. The companion to all these children is Snoopy (Jamie Lambdin-Bolin) a dog with a remarkable fantasy life and human qualities.

As the cast of six talented actors explore life's great questions, they are joined by an able crew including Brandon Bolin as director, George Mann as music director, and Sharla Cameron and Tina Dale as co-producers. Shannon Stoddard doubles her role as Sally by also serving as choreographer, while Snoopy actor Jamie Lambdin-Bolin serves as costumer. Audra Sargent serves as stage manager; Gary Cameron is the set builder/designer; Sharla Cameron is responsible for props; and Gray Ashton is the lighting designer. Light and sound operators are Joanne Peterson and Megan Bagley. Backstage crew includes Michael Fox, Tonya McCoy and Elysa

Wesley Fox is enjoying the process of discovering Charlie Brown: "He's a kid who is trying his hardest to do what's right. As he navigates repeated failures, Charlie never loses his positive outlook, and his generally good attitude endears him to his friends and to the audience as well."

"What can I say about Lucy Van Pelt?" says Megan Henley. "Is she bossy? Yes. Maybe even a little mean sometimes? Sure. But I like to think that underneath it all she's just a big softy with good intentions. I can't help but feel a certain kinship to a little girl who's trying to make her voice be heard in this big, loud world."

In his role as Schroeder, Eric Wells explains: "Being an adult playing children who are children that act like adults has made this an

amazing experience that I can't wait for our audiences to see. And having this chance to play Schroeder is one I'll take with me for the rest of my life."

"Sally Brown has been a dream role of mine for years," says Shannon Stoddard. "I'd listen to the soundtrack while driving back and forth to college and have always wanted to be a part of this show! Sally is sassy, dramatic, uninhibited and not afraid to speak her mind...honestly, I wish I was more like her! Whereas Charlie Brown is the ultimate optimist, Sally is the complete opposite and looks at everything with such pragmatism. Through her I get to show all the frustration little kids experience and turn it around into creating her own rules to live by (as so many kids do)."

Coleman Smith is playing his largest role to date: "Seeing the Peanuts comic strip in color in the Sunday paper was always exciting to me. I especially love Linus as a character because he is very simple and seems to know so much and so little at the same time. It's interesting to see him interact with others in the Peanuts gang who either don't care or don't understand what he's saying."

In keeping with Snoopy's big personality but lack of vocabulary, Jamie Lamdin-Bolin simply says "Woof!"
