



Meet Our Cast!

Charlotte Scott (Randa) – My FSLT Journey began in 2022 when I played Miss Hannigan in *Annie* and have since appeared in *All I Really Need to Know I Learned in Kindergarten* and played the Stepmother in *Cinderella*. This is my first non-musical show at FSLT, and it's taking all my strength not to break into song! Being a part of both plays and musicals has taught me to approach life from a logical point of view, and logic dictates that I should be on stage as often as possible in the near future! When I am not on stage, you can find me performing in the viola section with the Fort Smith Symphony, directing the Ozark Bronze Handbell Ensemble, or working as an attorney for Arkansas Department of Finance and Administration.

Sharla Cameron (Dot) - I was an avid patron with FSLT for years! In 2019, my granddaughter wanted to audition for *Miracle on 34th Street*, so my husband told my nervous granddaughter he would try out if she would! Well, they both got parts, and because I would come and hang out at rehearsals, I ended up being an "extra" in the show. Fast forward to 2021, when the theatre reopened after COVID, we were back. This time, my husband was in *Clue*, and I helped with the set and had a small off-stage speaking role. I started doing props for many shows when Tina Dale asked me to be her props mistress for her first show, *Holiday Channel Christmas Movie Wonderthon*. I have been deeply involved, mostly with props, ever since. In 2023, I had my first bigger role(s) in the show, *All I Really Need to Know I Learned in Kindergarten*! I am ecstatic to be in this show with this intimate and remarkable cast and crew! I feel like "Dot" is a lovable character with a quirky side! I LOVE getting laughs!

Mary Beth McAlvain (MarlaFaye) – 25 years at FSLT and they still have not gotten rid of me! My debut on our stage was in 1999, performing in *Five Women Wearing the Same Dress*. Since then, I have been involved in 49 shows, including the most recent *All I Really Need to Know I Learned in Kindergarten, The Lost Boy, Hello Dolly*, and *Ann*. Although I do not see the comparisons between Marlafaye and myself, I have had a hoot bringing her to life!

Tina Dale (Jinx) – I got my start with FSLT as a member of the chorus in *The Sound of Music*. Soon after, I had my first speaking part as Kate Sullivan in *Other People's Money*. I was bitten by the theatre bug and have never looked back. Since then, I have been on the FSLT stage in about 20 productions, directed four plays, and volunteered in numerous ways over the past 14 years. Some of my most memorable roles have included Mrs. Braddock in *The Graduate*, Miss Scarlet in *Clue*, Birdie Hubbard in *The Little Foxes*, Corie Bratter in *Barefoot in the Park*, and Helen Hubbard in *Murder on the Orient Express*. Much like my character, "Jinx," in *The Savannah Sipping Society*, I have found a family at Fort Smith Little Theatre, a family who has celebrated the triumphs and comforted through the heartaches. I wouldn't trade them for all the cocktails or iced tea in the South.





History of the FSLT Harlequin Man

In the early 1960s, Al Reis, owner of Reis Art Gallery and School, and Jay Anderson, one of his instructors, created the piece of sculpture that has come to be known as the Harlequin Man. It stood outside our first theatre on North "O" Street for more than two decades, and thus became a symbol of FSLT. Unfortunately, over the years, the elements took their toll. When we moved to our current location on North 6th Street, a patron, Louis Robinson, cleaned and repainted it before moving it to our new lobby in 1987. In 1994, thanks to the late Mickey Suggs, the structure was repaired and glass was replaced. In 2013, the Harlequin Man underwent a facelift sponsored by Paula and Steve Sharum. Following repairs made by Bob Wright Stained Glass, the Harlequin Man was then moved to a place of honor as part of our lobby renovation. Positioned on a raised platform in our center window, the colorful symbol of our theatre is now prominently displayed for all FSLT patrons to enjoy.
