"Ladies, to a girls' weekend!" - Dot, Girls' Weekend

Characters climb ladders, stow the hostess in closets, salsa dance, and indulge in too much wine in the contemporary farce *Girls' Weekend* written by Karen Schaeffer. Tina Dale directs the fast-paced comedy which plays May 29-June 7 at FSLT.

Director Dale says, "When I originally read the script, I laughed so much I was crying. I knew directing a show with this much physical comedy would be a challenge. But I also knew it would be fun, and I wanted to bring all that laughter to our theater."

Playwright Schaeffer started as a community theatre volunteer in Des Moines, Iowa. She wrote *Girls' Weekend* in response to a scarcity of comic roles for mature women in contemporary theatre. Originally produced by Des Moines Community Playhouse in 2014, the show has become a popular choice for community theatres nationwide which has led Schaeffer to write other comic scripts.

It starts as a simple plan. Divorcees Dot (Micki Voelkel) and Meg (Rikkee Black) travel to a remote cabin in Minnesota to host a book club meeting/girls' weekend. Joining them are ditzy book club member Carol (Carol Sikes) and Meg's daughter Ellie (Jamie Lambdin-

Bolin). While wild child Dot is ready to relax and go a little crazy, the more conventional Meg is wrestling with a big secret - she has been dating Dot's thirtyyear-old son Stephen (Ian Miller). When Stephen shows up at the cabin ready to take the relationship to the next level, chaos ensues. To complicate matters, Carol is desperately trying to get pregnant. When her temperature reveals she is ovulating, she invites her husband Rick (Logan Parks) back to the cabin to make a baby - in secret. Meg's daughter Ellie also is not short of male companionship as she runs into old college acquaintance Bubba (Robert Montgomery) who invites her to visit a local bar for karaoke. Why the secrecy? No one wants to ruin Dot's much anticipated girls' weekend. As the evening becomes steadily more chaotic, small town Sheriff Tom (Brett Short) shows up to announce that the weekenders are snowed in - and he immediately becomes smitten with Meg. Will Dot's girls' weekend survive the onslaught of men? Select your seat soon to find out!

To accompany the talented and experienced cast, director Dale is supported by assistant director Kim Pierson, stage manager Robyn Fowler, and producer Joe Graham. Set design is by Gary Cameron with construction help from Brad Kidder, Robert Montgomery, Scott Black, and Robyn Fowler. Prop master is Sharla Cameron; T.J. Dudley is lighting designer; Sam Glover will be in the tech booth; and the running crew includes Kivalina Lawrence and Lexi Housley.

New to the FSLT stage is Logan Parks who has extensive theatre experience elsewhere: "After a break from acting, it's been wonderful dipping my toes back into the theatre world at FSLT. Everyone has been welcoming, kind and so funny!"

FSLT veteran Brett Short loves how ihis character introduces himself as 'Sheriff. Sheriff Tom Lane.' Short explains "Tom

wants to announce his presence with authority and assurance, but the second he lays eyes on Meg he is immediately smitten...he begins to stumble over his words as he is struck by some powerful amorous lightning."

Carol Sikes is finding the technical factors of doing a fast-paced farce to be a fun challenge: "Coordinating the timing of entrances and exits with other characters even down to doors opening/closing requires razor sharp precision and focus. Just like a dance!" FSLT favorite Ian Miller finds the physical challenge exhilarating: "My favorite part of playing Stephen is the situations he gets into and all the physical comedy bits I get to perform."

Robert Montgomery loves being back at FSLT after a long absence: "Performing in a modified thrust theatre is always special. I love the fact that when on stage here, you're among the audience sharing the show, breathing in the moment."

Long time FSLT veteran Micki Voelkel says, "I'm having a glorious time. Dot is much less risk averse than I am, so I am enjoying the physical challenge of rolling around the floor and behaving outlandishly." Rikkee Black agrees: "Micki and I are basically playing a modern-day version of Lucy and Ethel from *I Love Lucy*"! It is so much fun!" Jamie Lambdin-Bolin sums it up: "It's controlled chaos!"

Girls' Weekend opens May 29 with additional 7:30 pm performances scheduled for May 30-31 and June 4-7. A matinee will be performed at 2 p.m. Sunday June 1. Tickets for the opening night performance are \$20; all other performances are \$13. For Season Flex Pass patrons, seat selection will begin at 7:00 a.m. Saturday, May 17. Tickets will go on sale to the general public beginning 7:00 a.m. Thursday, May 22. You can buy tickets and select your seats online at fslt.org or by calling 479-783-2966 (extn. 2).
